

Who is Julian Assange and what has he done?

Julian is a publisher, and the world's foremost freedom of speech campaigner.

He has won more than two dozen awards for his publishing and journalism including Amnesty International, Time magazine and Walkley awards.

Julian stands for informing the public about what their governments do in their name.

Julian Assange and WikiLeaks publications have exposed war crimes and corruption and have been used as evidence in court cases around the world.

Since April 2019 Julian has been imprisoned in Belmarsh Prison in London, fighting extradition to the United States.

He has been detained in the UK in one form or another since 7th December 2010 — over 11 years.

Why does the US government want to extradite him?

Julian languishes in the UK's highest security prison, and faces a 175 year sentence if extradited to the US.

The 175 year sentence is merely for receiving and publishing truthful information in the public interest such as the Collateral Murder gunning down of civilians, including children and two Reuters journalists, in Iraq.

False evidence has been used against him. It has been revealed that the CIA actively plotted to assassinate him. The UK courts are being instrumentalised.

Why do we have to stop the extradition?

Our rights are at risk. Freedom of speech here in Britain is at risk, as the US claims global jurisdiction and our government also seeks to make publishing truthful documents a crime.

Our right to know what our government is doing in our name, with our tax money, is under unprecedented threat.

All our freedoms are at risk.

If Julian Assange is extradited, it will set a precedent that anyone, anywhere in the world, can be jailed for publishing the truth.

The US government wants to use the case against Julian to change the nature of society fundamentally — from one where journalists and publishers are able to inform the public and hold governments to account, to one where a publisher can be jailed for life if they publish truthful documents about war crimes.

Politicians from across the political spectrum, all major human rights, free speech and media organizations have publicly expressed their opposition to his extradition.

We need you. Speak up! Fight for freedom of speech. Not only for Julian, but for all of us, and for the future of our loved ones.
